Animal Rocks

You'll need...

Smooth pebbles, craft paints (acrylic will work best), paintbrushes

How it's done...

Turn smooth pebbles you collect from the beach or the garden this summer into cute animals. Using a little imagination you can create ladybirds, hedgehogs or even the family pets!



Puffy Paint

You'll need...

Shaving Foam, white glue, food colouring

How it's done...

Mix white glue and shaving foam equally in a container for the texture you want. Add drops of food colouring (it will dry darker), stir with a stick or straw. Repeat for all your colours. Choose a big sheet of paper and paint away!



Bubble Painting

You'll need...

Paint, water and washing up liquid, paper, straw for blowing and mixing

How it's done...

Mix your paint with a little water and some washing up liquid. Blow into your mixture through a straw until it bubbles up. Gently place your paper onto the bubbles to make a print of it and allow to dry. Repeat with other colours.



Marbled Paper

You'll need...

Shaving cream, watercolour paint, baking tray, paper, straw or swirl stick for mixing, card for scraping

How it's done...

Spray shaving foam onto a baking tray in a thick layer and add drops of colouring. Swirl the colours through the foam with a mixing stick, then gently press your thick paper onto the surface to make gorgeous marbled paper.



Full-size Portrait

You'll need...

Sheets of A4 paper, taped together (or the back of an old sheet of wallpaper), coloured pens

How it's done...

Use a roll of wallpaper or sheets of paper taped together, draw around one of the kids (or get one of them to draw around the other), then get them to colour in the face, eyes, hair and clothes.



Sticker Tree

You'll need...

Brown, red and green craft paint, paper.

How it's done...

Paint your hand and wrist for the tree trunk 'handprint' and stamp onto some paper with your hand spread wide. When it's dry use your finger tips to dot red and green leaves onto the tree, a bit of messy fun!
